Summer Mission Trip Oaxaca - Yucatan, July 22 – July 31, 2005

Half the year is over and we praise God for his mercy and grace in guiding the Mexico Outreach Mission this summer. We will be traveling to the state of **Oaxaca** in southern Mexico where 50 brothers and sisters from five churches will work together to minister the love of Christ. Pray that His heart of love and compassion would become ours as well.

Our emphasis during this mission trip will be **disciple training programs** so that we can better equip the local ministers and volunteers to bring more people to share the Gospel. Pastor Dan Low and Pastor Paul Suh will be among those leading these programs.

Last summer, we planted the seeds for the new church/mission center in **Los Mochis**. So far we have been able to put up the walls of the building, but additional funds are still needed. Please pray for the completion of the **Garden of Faith/ Come to Christ/Bread of Life Mission Center**. This center will house a Bible teaching institute that will serve the surrounding community, especially native Indians who can then spread the Gospel to their mountain villages.

In **San Telmo**, the church that was planted two years ago and the school that was started last year are flourishing



thanks to God's guiding hands and many prayers. Kindergarten through second grade and adult education classes are taught in the new school. This school presents a wonderful opportunity for anyone with a burden to do short term mission work and/or teach English.

The first floor of the **Divine Grace/ Come to Christ/Bread of Life Church** in Tijuana is finished and we will have a dedication ceremony during our fall mission trip.

May God continue to bless the outposts for Christ that have been planted and may the seeds that been sown in the hearts of the Mexican people draw them closer to Him.

The team will travel to Tijuana and San Telmo where we will build a house for an impoverished family whose current home is shown on the right. We prayerfully ask for funds to support this building project that will cost approximately \$3,000. Our hope is that the community will see God's love through this building project.

We will also be distributing 1200 gift bags that were assembled at the Mexico Christmas Gift Outreach.

The October opening of the Ven a Cristo and Bread of Life Church inside the Tijuana jail is shown at the left. We have permission to build a community center/medical and dental clinic in the jail to take care of the inmates and their families. We pray that through God's grace more lives will be saved and people will be spiritually reformed through the knowledge and ac-

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Los Mochis Mission Center

This summer, from July 21 - 30, a team of brothers and sisters will go to Los Mochis where we will dedicate the **Come to Christ-Bread of Life - Faith Garden Mission Center** in Teroque, Los Mochis. The Center will serve the neighborhood and will also be the training place for Project Daniel, a ministry where five Tauhumara Indians from the nearby Copper Canyon mountain area will be provided education, room and board, with the hope that they will spread the Gospel when they return to their people. Inside the Mission Center's dormitory, there will be a plaque to honor Minister Esther Wang. Our hope is that her life story will be an inspiration to all who enters the Mission Center. Her life began over ninety years ago in China. Throughout her hardships and trials, she was faithful and continued to serve God all her life. We pray that through her books, such as *Amazing Grace*, people will know that our God is their hope for their future.

Tijuana Prison Ministry



“I was in prison and you came to visit me . . . When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?” The King will reply, “I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.”

The main focus of the prison ministry is caring for the spiritual, emotional and physical well being of the inmates. Although the inmates have been rejected by society, they are God's children and God commands us to love them. In the harsh prison environment, there is a stark contrast between the saved and unsaved. By giving hope through Jesus Christ, lives can be transformed. In 2005, we dedicated a church called **Iglesia Ven a Cristo y Pan de Vida /Come to Christ-Bread of Life Church** in the Tijuana Prison. Our prayer is that the inmates will be saved and people will be truly reformed when they reenter society.

When a man is imprisoned, his whole family suffers. Lives are shattered and families are broken. At the Tijuana jail, family members are allowed to visit on Saturdays, and it is heart wrenching when wives and children have to leave at the end of a visit and the men line up to return to their cells. The



Family Center will be a healing place where families can learn about Christian love and the healing presence of Jesus. The Center will provide Men's, Women's and Children's ministries where individuals can learn what it means to be a Christian parent or child. To show Christ's love in tangible ways, counseling and medical/dental services will be offered at the Center as well. Please pray that God will supply the needs for the funding for the Family Center.

In Honor of Minister Esther Wang

The above verse aptly describes our beloved Sister Minister Esther Wang who went to be with the Lord this year. Minister Wang devoted her life to Christ and imprisoned for 18 years in China for her Christian faith. In her books, Esther wrote how God was ever faithful and by her side during her internment. Her book “How Amazing” will be translated into Spanish. Esther demonstrated through her life and ministry that Jesus Christ is the reason we live and our encouragement for fulfill the Great Commission.

To honor her, a plaque with her name and the above verse will be installed at the Tijuana Jail Family Center, as a light in the darkness for all who enter.

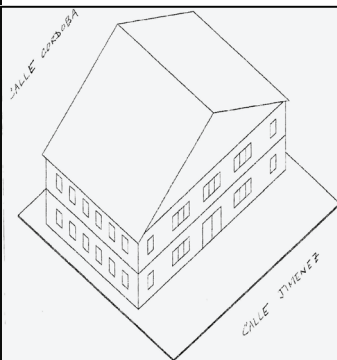

Summer Mission Trip to Panama June 22— July 1, 2007

This summer's mission trip will mark a new direction for MOM as we will go to Panama to minister and serve.

Panama is an important juncture between North and South America, as well as the East and West. The country is a mixture of cultures, languages and beliefs. Native Indians make up about six per cent of Panama's population and about 200,000 overseas Chinese live there, which gives Panama the largest Chinese population in Latin America. The first Chinese came to Panama 200 years ago to build the railroads, and even more Chinese are coming to Panama in recent years.

Our goal this summer is to spread the Good News to the unreached Panamanian Indians – Chocos Indians and to Panama's Chinese immigrants.

To that end, we are building the Come to Christ, Bread of Life Missionary Training Center in Chepo, about 50 kilometers east of Panama City. The center will equip local pastors and laypersons, as well as people from throughout the region, to become missionaries through Bible training, one-on-one discipleship and other programs.

Although the Good News has been shared in Panama, it is not always the true Gospel because it has been mixed with local culture and superstitious beliefs.

After a three-day disciple training seminar for 100 people from throughout Central America, the MOM mission team will split with one team targeting the hearts of Chinese



in Panama City's Chinatown, and another team traveling south to minister to the Chocos Indians.

The Chinatown team will partner with a local church to minister to the local Chinese. The second group will travel south to Santa Fe in the state of Darien, where they will minister to native Panamanian Indians in a place called Enberas Puru. We will hold a vacation Bible school, provide services, and ask that the Lord work in their midst to bring about life changes.

After that, we will embark on a river ministry to El Sato where we will stop at different villages along the way. In Cucumatid, in the Lake Bayano district, we will partner with another church to hold Gospel outreach meetings.

Our hope is that this mission trip will be a life-changing experience for the people we serve and also deepen our own relationship with our Savior.

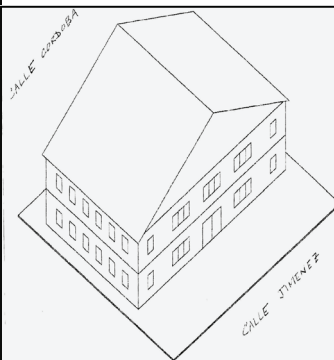

MEMO: Panama Mission Building Fund

Panama Mission Trip, June 22– July 1, 2007 Chepo Missionary Training Center

Our first mission trip to Panama was incredibly spiritually enriching. Many seeds were planted as sixty brothers and sisters from across the United States and Mexico worked side by side in various ministries.

From June 22—July 1, we journeyed from Panama City to Chepo, Santa Fe, Cucunati, and Canglon.

The Panamanians were surprised that a group of Asians had come to minister and serve them. We were charting new ground and His guiding hand was ever present as we served Panamanian Chocos Indians and Chinese immigrants.

A Cantonese speaking team led by Pastor Wilson Lee ministered to Chinese workers in Panama City's Chinatown.

In **Cucunati**, a poor fishing village in the middle of the jungle, there is a small church that has been without a roof for eighteen years. Even though the church has been isolated, the church's pastor has been praying continuously for a roof.

During an amazing morning worship service in Cucunati, a "portal from heaven" opened and many people felt God's presence in a palpable way. There was a call for donations for the church roof, and through God's grace, \$3,000 was raised. None of us knew that \$3,000 was the exact amount needed to raise the roof. God works in amazing ways.

In **Canglon**, at the end of the Pan American highway, there is no pavement, only mud. The governor of the Darien state joined us. There, in the midst of this dark

and bleak place, one of our team members, Pastor Jose Luis—a former inmate from the Tijuana jail, shared his testimony. God touched the governor's heart and she accepted Jesus Christ. Only God could make this possible in such an unlikely place.

To further His kingdom, we will be building a **Missionary Training Center in Chepo**. Our hope and prayer is that this Center will be a beacon of light. Local pastors and lay people will be equipped to spread the Gospel to their hometowns and throughout Latin America. Phase I (see diagram left) will cost \$50,000.

Many brothers and sisters who went on the journey felt that this was one of the most moving and uplifting mission trips they have experienced. We thank God for his love and mercy.
