We planned and prepared for the Camp, but much of that preparation went out the window and what took place was done by the grace of God. And we, people from 3 Ling Liang churches along with other team members, are in awe and are grateful to have been granted a time serving together for the praise of His Name.

104 brothers and sisters from North and Central America went to villages in Margarito, Ipeti, Arrima, LaJas Blanca, and Perto Lara. At Emberra Puru Church team members had to minister to the people with only lights from their flashlights. At Cucunatti, a fishing village in the midst of a jungle, the team conducted a revival meeting. The church there has grown and thrived in the last 3 years. At La Palma, the city founded by African slaves, the team conducted a revival meeting followed by medical and dental ministries with flash lights. At Alto Cristo the team had a wonderful fellowship meeting with the church there. Many children accepted altar calls during revival meetings. A baptism service was held in the river for 9 youth of San Blas.
